Buried or inaccessible hydrants may result in a delay at the scene of the emergency. Your assistance in keeping hydrants clear is greatly appreciated!

Please Keep Your Sidewalks Clear

For the safety of pedestrians, City ordinance requires property owners to clear their sidewalks of snow and ice in a timely manner.



Failure to comply with this ordinance may result in a fine, court costs and/or payment to the City for costs associated with removal.

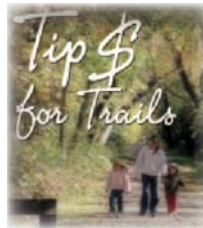

**Tip\$ for Trails
Utility Bill Round Up Program**

Utility customers of Indianola have the opportunity to voluntarily contribute funds through their utility bill to support the city trails system. Customers may choose to do one or both of these options

- First, a customer may elect to "round up" their bill to the nearest dollar with the additional rounding amounts being credited to the trails program.



- Second, a customer may add a flat dollar amount to their bill with the additional payment accumulated for trails. With either option, or a combination of both, the amount contributed will be accumulated for the trails system and is tax deductible.

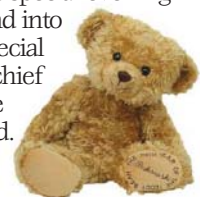

PUBLIC NOTICE

City ordinance 69.10 prohibits parking on any public street or alley during a snow emergency parking ban.

Such ban is in effect when two or more inches of snow or ice *has fallen or is predicted* by the National Weather Service. Ban shall continue **for the duration of the storm and for forty-eight hours past the end of the storm** unless streets are fully opened after plowing.

If your vehicle is in violation of the snow emergency parking ban, you will be subject to a \$35.00 parking ticket and/or your vehicle may be towed at your expense.

Snow emergency parking ban will be posted on cable channel 86, the city web site: indianolaiowa.gov or can be confirmed by contacting the Indianola Police Department.

Please take special note of this ordinance and plan accordingly.
