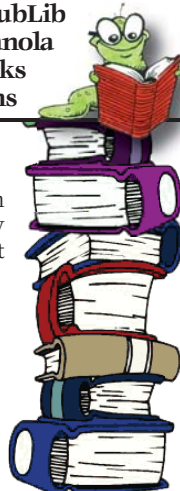

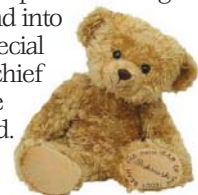

PUBLIC NOTICE

City ordinance 69.10 prohibits parking on any public street or alley during a snow emergency parking ban.

Such ban is in effect when two or more inches of snow or ice **has fallen or is predicted** by the National Weather Service. Ban shall continue **for the duration of the storm and for forty-eight hours past the end of the storm** unless streets are fully opened after plowing.

If your vehicle is in violation of the snow emergency parking ban, you will be subject to a \$35.00 parking ticket and/or your vehicle may be towed at your expense.

Snow emergency parking ban will be posted on cable channel 86, the city web site: indianolaiowa.gov or can be confirmed by contacting the Indianola Police Department.
