

### Wood Mulch

Mulch is available at the Indianola Brush Facility during normal hours of operation free of charge. Individuals wanting mulch will need to provide their own containers and assistance is not normally provided except on the second Saturday of the month.

On the second Saturday of the month from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm assistance for loading pick-ups and/or trailers is provided for a fee of \$10.00 per load. The fee helps to off-set equipment and personnel expense.

### Special Water Meters

Hydrant/sewer reduction meters may be used for watering new sod/seed/landscape/fill pool or ground settling. Wastewater charges will not be assessed when using these meters. The meters are available on a first come, first-served basis.

### Veterans Memorial Pool Opening Delayed

Pool officials discovered a problem with the pool's main circulation pump on Tuesday, May 15, and immediately began the search for a solution. The city is working with multiple sources around the Midwest to solve the problem as quickly as possible. The pool had been scheduled to open Monday, May 21.

Recreation Superintendent Doug Bylund said, "The pool is filled with water and looks ready for use. But the problem is, if that pump isn't working, we can't keep the water filtered. The water will become too cloudy and unsafe for swimming."

Iowa law states that a pool may not operate unless the water can pass a clarity test.

Bylund said, "We certainly don't want to delay the opening of the pool any longer than necessary. We will notify the public through the media as soon as we can offer a safe swimming experience for our patrons."

Take a fun-sized version of the Parks & Recreation mascot, Scooter the Squirrel, on your next vacation, day trip, or for an afternoon in your backyard.

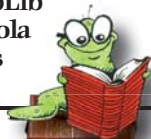
