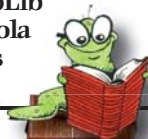

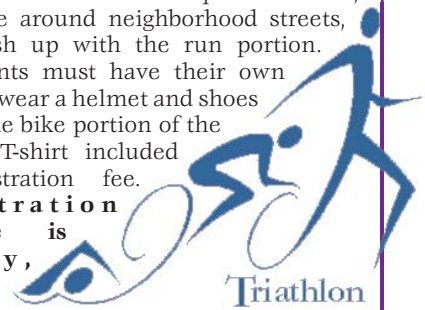

Swim, Bike, Run!! Start exercising now for this mini-triathlon for kids age 7-14 and families. Participants will be divided into 3 divisions: 7-10 year olds, 11-14 year olds, and a Family division. 7-10 year olds will swim 50 yards, bike 1 mile and run 1/4 mile. 11-14 year olds will swim 100 yards, bike 2 miles, and run 1/2 mile. The family division will consist of 3 family members; 1 family member will swim 100 yards, another family member will bike 2 miles, and the final family member will run 1/2 mile. Participants begin with the swim portion at Veterans Memorial Aquatic Center, then bike around neighborhood streets, and finish up with the run portion.
