Sunday: Noon - 4 p.m.

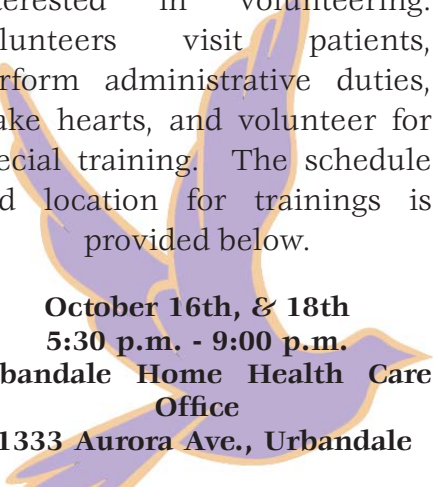
Fees still apply for brush and limbs

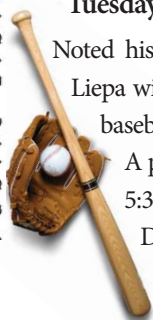
