Sunday: Noon - 4 p.m.

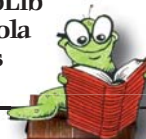

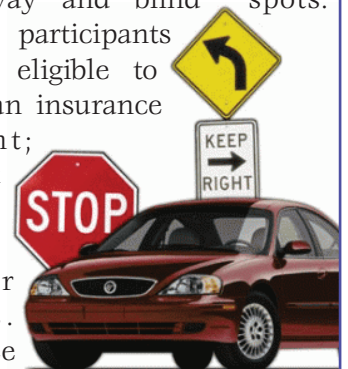
