****Please note that a fee will still be charged for televisions and monitors during this event. Prices can be found below.****

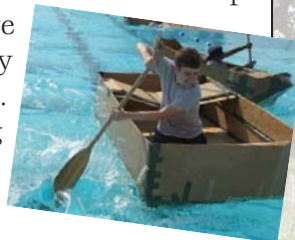

Veterans Memorial Aquatic Center

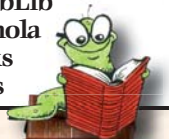
