Now customers can receive important alerts from Indianola Municipal Utilities via email, text message or both! The utility's new Alert System is free to all customers and easy to sign up for. Simply go to [www.i-m-u.com/Alerts.aspx](http://www.i-m-u.com/Alerts.aspx) to enter a valid email address and mobile phone number (if desired) to begin receiving utility alerts. Customers can unsubscribe at any time.

This new alert system is not designed to target specific addresses or neighborhoods. Therefore, IMU will continue to give advanced notice when known addresses will be affected by planned water, electric or network service projects.

The new alert system will be used to communicate information during widespread utility outages, including estimated outage times. Subscribers will also be alerted when it's important to reduce or curtail electric consumption.

**PUBLIC NOTICE**

**City Ordinance 69.10 prohibits parking on any public street or alley during a snow emergency parking ban.**

Such ban is in effect when two or more inches of snow or ice has fallen or is predicted by the National Weather Service. Ban shall continue for the duration of the storm and for forty-eight hours past the end of the storm unless streets are fully opened after plowing. If your vehicle is in violation of the snow emergency parking ban, you will be subject to a \$35.00 parking ticket and/or your vehicle may be towed at your expense. Snow emergency parking ban will be posted on cable channel 86, the city website [www.indianolaiowa.gov](http://www.indianolaiowa.gov) or can be confirmed by contacting the Police Dept. at 961-9400. Please take special note of this ordinance and plan accordingly.

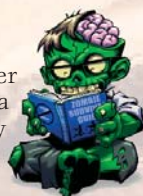
