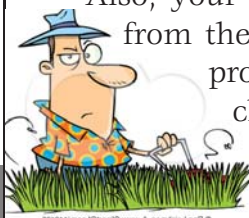

Wood Mulch

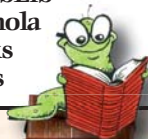

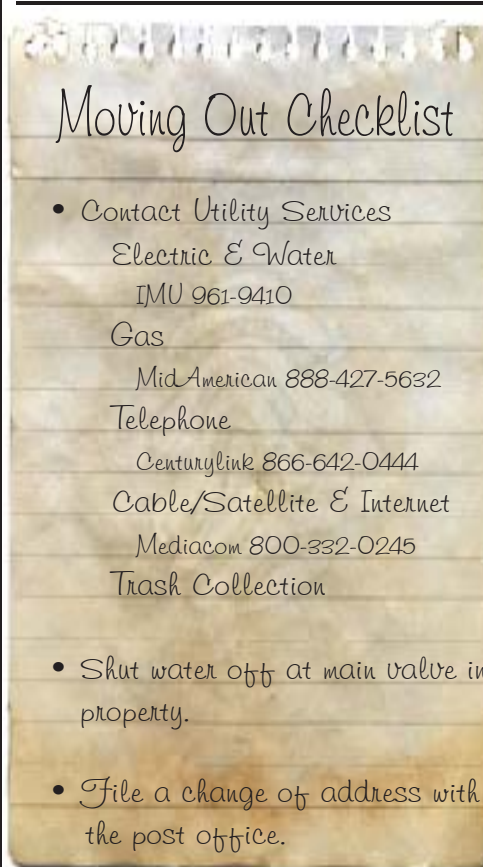
